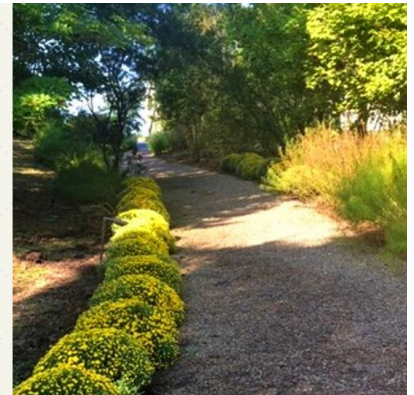
DEEPER INTO SILENCE
